What will remote learning look like for my student?

While the implementation might look different at each grade level, the overall approach represents a commitment to optimizing synchronized learning for all students. This includes live instruction of all core academic subjects as well as special areas. Virtual visits from our related service professionals will also be a part of the remote learning school day for our primary team. A full day of instruction will be provided Monday - Thursday. On Fridays, synchronous instruction will continue for Math and Literacy; however, the remainder of the day will be used for one-on-one check-ins, enrichment opportunities, and teacher professional development.

What is synchronous learning?

Synchronous learning is used to describe an approach where a group of students are engaged in learning at the same time. For Summit Academy, this means that students have joined a Google Meet via a link in their Google Classroom and the teacher will lead the students in lessons and activities.

How do I or my student access Google Classroom?

In order to access Google Classroom, you must be signed into Google using your student's username and password. This information can be provided to you by your student's homeroom teacher. We are working on a bank of tutorial videos to help students and parents navigate the technology side of remote learning.
